Office for National Statistics

[ONS](#) are the UK's national statistical institute and the largest producer of official statistics in the UK. They are also the only government department with the production of statistics as its main role. ONS are independent of ministers and report through the UK Statistics Authority to Parliament and the devolved administrations of Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. The UK Statistics Authority, which was established on 1 April 2008 by the Statistics and Registration Service Act 2007. Under the Act, the Authority is responsible for promoting and safeguarding the production and publication of official statistics which serve the public good. Further information on the Authority, and the Statistics and Registration Service Act, is available on the [UK Statistics Authority website](#). The main responsibilities of ONS are:

- The collection, compilation, analysis and dissemination of a range of key economic, social and demographic statistics about the UK
- The provision of statistical leadership and methodological advice for the benefit of UK official statistics
- Representation of the UK internationally as the national statistical institute

These responsibilities span more than 650 different statistical releases a year which rely on a broad range of methods and systems. All outputs are produced in line with the 'Code of Practice for Official Statistics' and relevant quality standards.

Local Health

[Local Health](#) has been developed by Public Health England to present data at a 'small area' level. Local Health gives you access to interactive maps and reports at ward level and local authority level.

End Child Poverty

The Campaign to [End Child Poverty](#) is made up of more than 100 organisations from civic society including children's charities, child welfare organisations, social justice groups, faith groups, trade unions and others, united in the vision of a UK free of child poverty. The website provides Child [poverty facts and figures](#) as well as statistical information about poverty in your area.

National Child and Maternal Health Network

The website was created by the [Child and Maternal Health](#) (ChiMat). ChiMat was established in 2008 as a national public health observatory to provide wide-ranging, authoritative data, evidence and practice related to children's, young people's and maternal health. This specialist observatory was part of the Yorkshire and Humber Public Health Observatory (YHPHO) which was part of a network of nine public health observatories (PHOs) in England. Since 1 April 2013, ChiMat have been part of Public Health England (PHE), an executive agency of the Department of Health. PHE has been established to protect and improve the nation's health and wellbeing and to reduce inequalities. It will lead on the development of a 21st-century health and wellbeing service, supporting local authorities and the NHS to deliver the greatest possible improvements in public health.

English Indices of Deprivation

Since the 1970s the Department for Communities and Local Government and its predecessors have calculated local measures of deprivation in England. This Statistical release contains the latest version of these statistics, the [English Indices of Deprivation](#) 2015 which update the 2010



Indices. It is important to note that these statistics are a measure of relative deprivation, not affluence, and to recognise that not every person in a highly deprived area will themselves be deprived. Likewise, there will be some deprived people living in the least deprived areas.
